UNESCO Chair on Intersectoral Safety for Disaster risk reduction and Resilience SPRINT-Lab University of Udine, Italy



Objective:

The webinar aims to begin exploring the role of UNESCO Chairs focused on disaster risk reduction and resilience, in the complex interplay between Education, Science, and Culture, to enhancing resilience and mitigating disasters.

The webinar will feature presentations from representatives of a selected group of UNESCO Chairs. Each Chair will outline their "position" within the broader UNESCO field(s), highlighting their specific activities and contributions towards disaster risk reduction and building resilience. The predefined positioning criteria have been conceived in consultation with the Disaster Risk Reduction Unit of UNESCO.

Additionally, Chairs will be asked to present case studies, projects or initiatives that highlight the role of the Chair as a catalyst for resilience, promoting the communities' capacity to prepare for, absorb, and adapt to shocks from natural hazards and climate impacts.

Finally, the webinar also aims to start fostering ongoing dialogue and collaboration among participating UNESCO Chairs.

Expected outcomes:

Participants are provided with an overview of the activities and initiatives of the involved disaster risk reduction and resilience-focused UNESCO Chairs. The meeting aims to encourage increased inter-sectoral collaborations toward the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals.

The UNESCO Chairs and their resilience-related activities are mapped and will be compiled in a concise report to be disseminated with the participants and the Disaster Risk Reduction Unit of UNESCO.
